

CODING ASSESSMENT








In our school we are conducting coding classes for Grade I-V students , students have taken to computer lab to conduct assessment.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES






SAFETY DAY *




SCIENCE ACTIVITY'S





In order to improve the artistic skill of the students "Palm tree painting "activity is conducted for Grade II Coloring students. drawing is a healthy way to relieve stress. PARTS OF LEAF





By the part of science activity Grade III students did parts of leaf activity. Different kinds of leaves were brought by the students and labeled the parts in the A4 sheet. by this activity students have learnt The most important job of a leaf is to make food for the plant. Leaves are the main (but not only) organ responsible for turning sunlight into food. Leaves have different sizes, shapes, and textures, depending on what is most useful in their habitat

CLAY POT ACTIVITY





Grade 4 students did clay pot activity in science subject, students prepared clay pots on their own . By this activity

students learnt " clay pots add many important nutrients like calcium, phosphorous, iron, magnesium and sulfur to food, which are extremely beneficial to our body. Clay is also alkaline and thus, acts neutralized the acidity in the food, which makes it easier for us to digest".





PARTS OF FLOWER



Grade 5 Students participated an interactive activity to learn about the different parts of a flower. We began by observing and dissecting various flowers to identify their components. We discovered that a typical flower consists of petals, sepals, stamens, and pistils. We created diagrams labeling each part and discussed their functions. To reinforce our understanding, we created a flower model using paper and clay, highlighting the relationship between the different parts. This engaging activity helped us grasp the intricate structure and importance of flowers in plant reproduction.

WIND MILL ACTIVITY
